

## **Take Back Control of Our Planet**

Coal mines will be progressively closed. Mining and energy workers have the skills and knowledge to rehabilitate the scars left by their previous operation and to develop new clean energy industries. Energy consumption will fall, jobs will be preserved, and work will become safer. Without the lure of profit a more equitable and rational sharing of the world's resources and products can be achieved.

Now as we watch the oncoming disaster and the inability of capitalist companies and governments to deal with it, state ownership and worker control have become more necessary than ever before.
